



Elaine interviews: Mariannick Bond-Madiot, singer, singing teacher and conductor of Corlay choir

Elaine So Mariannick, welcome to Spotlight's headquarters here in central

Brittany, in Gouarec. Um. First of all, before we talk about your forthcoming plans, um can we just have a little bit of a back story from you as to where

you're from and how you got into singing.

Mariannick Um. I am from er Brittany, from Morbihan. My father er was from Morbihan

and er all the family er er was in Morbihan. But I have spent a lot of er part of my er childhood in Loire-Atlantique. I should say my childhood till er the age of 30. But it's always a long childhood. And um, and nowadays, um gone back with um with the jobs, with the and also the proximity of the

So I decided to stop everything and to er try to pass a test to begin er other studies um in the Rennes University, in music and er carried on, also on the parallel of the singing lessons. So er I got er a a professional Diploma of education in music er in 2000 and also I got my er

another final um called DEM er musical er diploma.

point in your life.

And er so er having improved and passed my exams, I er I carry on, carried on on being a yes

er professional er singer, professional teacher.

Elaine Teacher too.

Mariannick Yes.

Elaine Well, the teaching would help with bringing in, as we say, funds too, isn't it?

Mariannick Yes?

Mariannick Um I have done two things. So I was er er, I was in the choir of singing

Mariannick Er I had the opportunity to sing with very, very er well known soloists in

European or world soloist. So that's very, very good. And then after as a professional er I've sung, I sing in choirs like so opera, choirs in Rennes, but also er in more reduced er number with Mélisme, the vocal that is actually um also around. We could we have sung er just without musicians, but we have been part of er a lot of concerts with Matheus orchestra in Paris, Toulouse, er Brest and er in Bretagne, of course. Also and in

Mariannick Ah, yes, in Corlay um because in Corlay I am conducting the choir. I have

been conducting for um 4, 5 years. You know, with the Covid, we lose the

memory of years.

Elaine Two years disappeared.

Mariannick And um there were a lot of er, there were some people um I have taught

already, long time ago in Mur de Bretagne and was saying, "Oh, we would like to have er another course. We would like to sing again er, er but in a little groups." And um so we are beginning this year a group of er Technique Vocale, so singing lessons, but with er 4, 5, 6 er people together or more, if they are. But to er try to work, to learn, sorry, all the technique, really, to try to improve the voice, to to feel better. And er so we are

beginning er end of September.

Mariannick Yes, yes. It's er after er from eight to nine, possibly um for everybody to

have the opportunity to come after works. And it's more

Elaine So it will be open to anybody. You don't have to be a a singer or

You just because sometimes they don't, people don't know that they can

sing.

Elaine No. It's a benefit, isn't it? So many benefits to singing to your health.

Mariannick Ah.It's totally a benefit. Because er it's um if we put apart of the fact that,

"No, I don't dare singing with other people with me". If we can say already that you can sing, everybody can sing, and we don't laugh at anybody, it will help your with your self confidence and things. But in a way, er if you imagine that er er in the vocal technique, all what you need is all what we need to stand to, to breathe properly, to have er a good balance with the muscles we have. Yes, everything in, I should say, in physiology, of the singing is good for the health and after it's good, also for er the mood and

And you must think that a good breathing is a good er er a assembling. It's the perfect things for the good health first, so. Um. No, and it's the pleasure also sometimes to sing, first to sing, even alone, but to sing with other people, to meet people, to er to discuss, to hear, to discover his voice, so we we discover also that we can hear. The singers, we are the only people who can er hear from the inside, because the musicians with an instrument he hears by the outside of the of their ear. So we have um, we can er hear ourself for ourself, for from the inside. It's er yes, it's fantastic. And um listening to people also singing, um we know that there are some um soff, you know, the mirror neurons. If you hear somebody who is singing very well, you have the impression of singing yourself. And there is a connection with the the brain and with the pleasure and er and the progress and the improvement. So

And will the, when people have attended, you know, they've been do doing the course with you? Will you be performing it somewhere? Or will it be, just be sort of in the meeting every week to sing together.

Mariannick

Oh, we need to, we need to perform somewhere. It's er sometimes it's very difficult. I have, I have had some er groups of people, er five, four people of "Oh, no, no, no. I don't want to sing. I don't want to perform". No problem. You will be on the back, and finally, on the back, thinking nobody is is listening. This person is singing very well and very loudly. And er no, it's, I think it's important. Of course, it's not. It's very dangerous to provoke. To say, "Ah you are afraid?" No. So you go, no. It's not that. You mustn't shock people. But it's helping them to, yes, to be heard and to, so first thing they must er get self confidence, confidence with their own voice and the pleasure of singing er outside. But I think it's good to have er it's a good way of improving. Sometimes I say, we do the concert and then we will do the repetition, the rehearsal.
